From the Pastor



Recently, I was asked an interesting question about our church: *If people had to pay to worship with CCUM, what would they be getting for their money?* On one hand, of course, this is an academic question. Welcome is at the heart of

who we are as a church, and nothing is required in order to join us on Sunday (or any other time). And on another hand, the question opens space for true examination.

What would a visitor get out of worshipping with us? And moreover, what do each of us receive by coming to church each Sunday?

When I imagine how we would answer these questions as a congregation, I cannot help but think that the most common answer would be “community”. Community is at the heart of our congregational identity, and no wonder – it’s something we do well. CCUM is a place where visitors are warmly greeted, and food seems to always be available. And over and over again, I have been impressed with how our congregation cares for those who are ill or unable to come to church. I don’t think it is an exaggeration to say that CCUM is community-centered.

This comes with some difficulties, too. When we worship as a community-centered community, the community can become the center of worship. We can begin to see Sunday morning as an opportunity to gather and share information. Business of the community can seep into time for prayer. This can leave those who are not part of the community feeling excluded, and those who are seeking prayer feeling frustrated.

Like CCUM, I also value community. And, in my experience, community is done better when it is not an end, but a means. The strongest communities I have been a part of are those who focus on something other than community. To have a focus beyond community is to strengthen and deepen our connection.

In August and September, we will focus on deepening our worship. How do we bring God to the center of worship? How do we make worshipping God more the center of our lives? We’ll explore this through written prayer, silent meditation, and spiritual practices we can do throughout the week. It is my hope that this renewed focus will strengthen the community that is so dear to us, and also deepen our lives of faith.

In the past few months, we’ve seen an outpouring of the former: crowds rallying at airports to welcome refugees; churches, cities and campuses establishing sanctuary for undocumented immigrants; courageous bystanders intervening to protect strangers from harassment and violence.

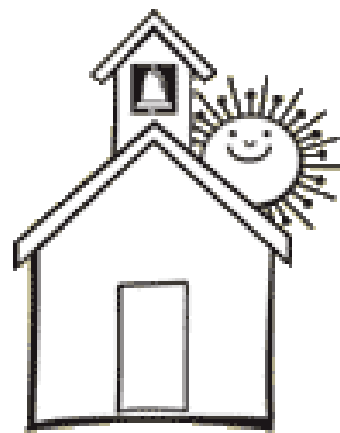
“But when it comes to loving the very people who have caused real harm to us and our neighbors – the crowd grows thin. And understandably so: Why should we extend love to those who perpetuate a politics of hate? What would loving those people even look like?

“...Of course, loving your enemies does not mean condoning their actions. Neither does it mean a disregard for the safety or well-being of those who an enemy may harm, including ourselves. Yet even with these caveats, it’s impossible to domesticate Jesus’ commandment: Seeking restoration rather than retribution for those who do evil is truly radical. As Martin Luther King Jr. put it, nonviolent enemy-love forces us to recognize “that evildoers are also victims and are not evil people.” Try thinking about that the next time you see an upsetting sound bite.”

Shasta Camp had to replace their water tank this year, at an expense the camp was not prepared to make at the time. We decided to help raise money to replace the tank.

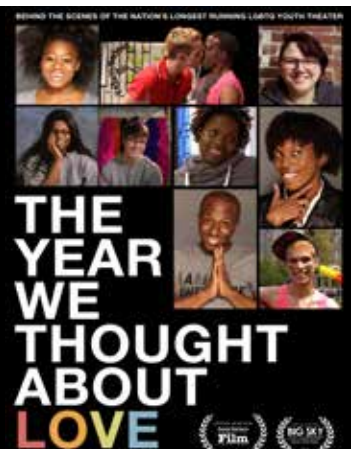
